Increasing the levels of public awareness regarding ethnobotanical research is intrinsically reliant upon the successful publication of results in appropriate scientific journals. Students, especially, often present their research findings at scientific congresses, but unfortunately these results are rarely published. The aims of this workshop are to provide an overview of the peer-review process, discuss the interests of specific journals, and encourage and advise novice researchers on how to successfully publish their work.
